Day 1

Bergen

The voyage starts in Bergen, the colorful capital of western Norway, where you can explore the UNESCO-listed Bryggen warehouses, ride the Fløibanen funicular for scenic views, indulge in fresh seafood at the fish market, or wander the lively harbor's charming streets and quays. Bergen is the gateway to the Norwegian fjords and the start of your coastal adventure.





Day 2

Florø → Måløy → Torvik → Ålesund → Geiranger* / Hjørundfjorden* → Ålesund → Molde

On the morning of the second day, you can greet the Havila Voyages headquarters near Torvik before arriving in Ålesund, known for its art nouveau architecture. During the summer months, you have the option to continue on to the stunning Geiranger Fjord, designated as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, to witness its dramatic waterfalls and steep mountain landscapes. During the autumn months we visit the untouched and majestic Hjørundfjorden.

Day 3

Kristiansund → Trondheim → Rørvik

It is morning when we dock in the historic city of Trondheim, which was founded over a thousand years ago. The Nidaros Cathedral is the city's major landmark. Furthermore, it is Norway's national shrine and one of the largest cathedrals in northern Europe. After our visit here, the voyage continues towards northern Norway.

Day 4

Brønnøysund → Sandnessjøen → Nesna → Ørnes → Bodø → Stamsund → Svolvær

As we journey further north, we'll celebrate crossing the Arctic Circle with a ceremony before exploring the Arctic regions. Witness the midnight sun during the summer months or see the Northern Lights illuminate the winter sky. Encounter the awe-inspiring power of the world's strongest tidal current, and spot the majestic sea eagles. In the evenings, you can explore the Lofoten fishing villages, admire the steep mountains, and learn about Viking history and heritage.



Day 5

Stokmarknes → Sortland → Risøyhamn → Harstad → Finnsnes → Tromsø → Skjervøy

As we continue through the narrow fjords and wild mountains, we'll arrive in Tromsø, a city with a rich history associated with hunting, fishing, and polar expeditions. Tromsø is also a gateway to the land of the Sami, Norway's indigenous people. Meeting the Sami and learning about their culture, including their unique connection with reindeer, is a truly unforgettable experience.

Day 6

Hammerfest → Havøysund → Honningsvåg → Kjøllefjord → Mehamn → Berlevåg

This is as far north as you can get — by land and sea. For many, the visit to the North Cape is a highlight and a goal for voyages along the Norwegian coast. Up here, in the polar landscape, nature is at its harshest and most desolate, but between bare plains and rugged cliffs, people cling on and reap nature's bounty — and you can have a taste of the catch. How about some king crab?

Day 7

Båtsfjord → Vardø → Vadsø → Kirkenes

Congratulations, you have now reached the easternmost point of your voyage! The border with Russia is only a few kilometers away, and you may notice that road signs in Kirkenes are written in both Norwegian and Russian. Consider joining one of our excursions to visit the border, or venture to the Snowhotel where everything is crafted from ice and snow for a unique and memorable experience.

Day 8

Mehamn → Kjøllefjord → Honningsvåg → Havøysund → Hammerfest → Øksfjord → Skjervøy → Tromsø

As we sail west and south, the polar landscape transforms, giving way to towering peaks. In the evening, we'll arrive in Tromsø, known as "The Paris of the North", where you can attend a midnight concert in the Tromsø Cathedral or take a stroll in the stunning midnight sun or under the mesmerizing Northern Lights. Explore the city's lively nightlife scene.

Day 9

Finnsnes → Harstad → Risøyhamn → Sortland → Stokmarknes → Svolvær → Stamsund

Next, we'll return to the stunning and picturesque Vesterålen and Lofoten Islands. We will enter the Vesterålen region in the morning, and in the evening we visit Lofoten. Along the coastline, you'll discover chalky, white, and sandy beaches alongside charming fishing villages, which still thrive on a vibrant fishing industry. The locals rely on coastal ships for everyday transportation. If the weather permits it, we'll venture into the narrow Trollfjord.



Day 10

Bodo → Ørnes → Sandnessjøen → Brønnøysund → Rørvik

At this juncture of our journey, we have ventured so far south that we have left the polar land behind and crossed the Arctic Circle. However, during winter, you may still witness the Northern Lights illuminating the night sky, while summer brings the magical midnight sun. As we sail, we'll pass by numerous small islands, islets, and skerries, including the unique Torghatten mountain, which features a hole in its center. If you're up for it, consider joining us for a hike on the mountain and explore the cavern.



Day 11

Trondheim → Kristiansund → Molde

We'll sail through the vast Trondheim fjord, flanked by rolling farmland on either side, before reaching the coast and the open sea once more. If you wish to disembark, Kristiansund offers the opportunity for a scenic bus tour along the Atlantic Ocean Road, considered one of the world's most beautiful drives. The road winds along islets and skerries, and after the tour, you can rejoin us in Molde.

Day 12

Ålesund → Torvik → Måløy → Florø → Bergen

On the final day of your journey, we'll take you through a varied coastal landscape that features rugged rocky mountains and an intricate network of straits and waterways between countless islands. The magnificent fjords and glaciers are located further inland. Our voyage concludes in Bergen, but you have the opportunity to join us for one last adventure – a captivating excursion through the city's history, flavors, and breathtaking views. We hope these new memories will be cherished, and we eagerly await the chance to welcome you back on board in the future.

As we travel through the polar region between Bodø and Honningsvåg we sail past the Lofoten Islands, where we fill the menu with Lofoten cod, Norwegian cod roe, dried fish, and cloudberries. If you fancy some meat, then why not try our free-range pork from the world heritage site of Vega?

The Arctic

DAY 7 - 9 **KIRKENES → HARSTAD**

The voyage from Kirkenes to Svolvær takes you through the harsh, Arctic northern area. Here, long-legged king crabs crawl about in the cold dark depths of the ocean, and on land, herds of reindeer graze in the tundra. Naturally, crab and reindeer feature on the menu during this part of the voyage as well as cured leg of lamb, Arctic char, and seaweed.

The Archipelago

DAY 10 - 12 **RØRVIK → BERGEN**

From Rørvik and south towards Bergen, the voyage runs through an archipelago where the rich waters have always provided both food and livelihoods. You can try klipfish and herring, both of which have been valuable exports from Norway for centuries, and local treats such as halibut and brown crab.

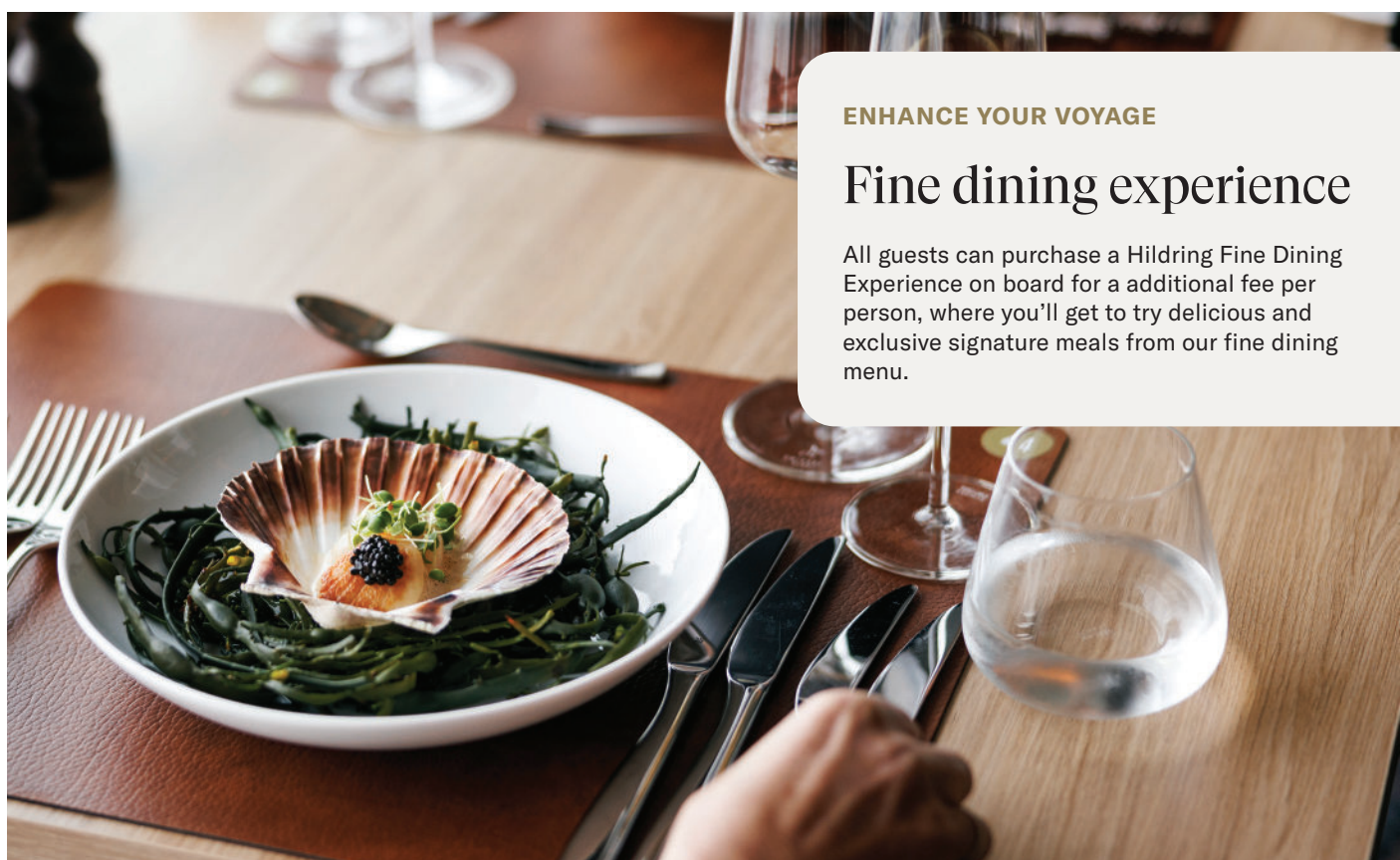

At the ship's highest point, deck nine, you'll find Havblikk Bar & Lounge. Here, you can unwind in comfortable lounge chairs under a glass roof, offering clear views of the Northern Lights, starry nights, or the unique glow of the midnight sun.

The recliners can be booked in advance, or you can consult with the reception to reserve one on board. These comfortable chairs, located on deck four, are ideal for a short break. Although this is a quiet area, the TV in the lounge may be used.

The onboard interior

The ship's interior reflects Norwegian quality and design, with materials and colours mirroring the scenic surroundings of your sailing journey. The furniture is supplied by well-known Norwegian manufacturers like Brunstad, Fora Form, and Ekornes. The mattresses are from Recticel in Åndalsnes. Our ships also feature unique works of art by artists such as Ørnulf Opdahl, Cathrine Knudsen, Ingrid Haukelidsæther, and Frank Brunner. On deck six, you'll find stories about shipowner Per Sævik and Havila's history, along with stories about coastal women, the indigenous coastal people of the North; the Sami, and medicine.



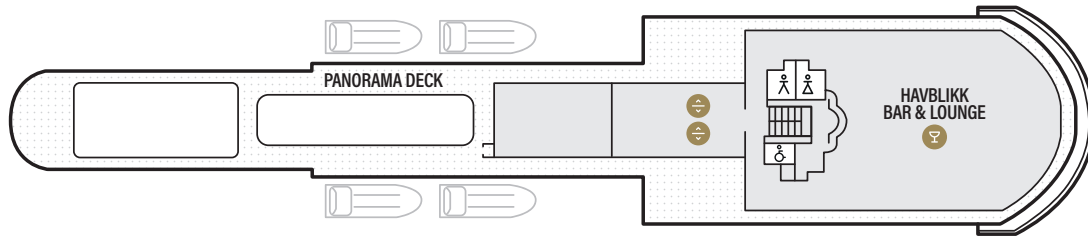
Medical care

Ensuring your safety during your travel is our top priority. While we sail along the coast and near harbors, we do not have a permanent doctor onboard. However, our staff is trained in first aid and can offer basic medical assistance. Additionally, we have a dedicated safety officer to ensure the well-being of both passengers and crew. On deck four, you'll find a well-equipped hospital ward with two sick bays. Should severe health issues arise, we maintain a direct connection to the shore through digital assistance, guaranteeing quick access to necessary support. For added safety, three defibrillators are strategically located on various decks.

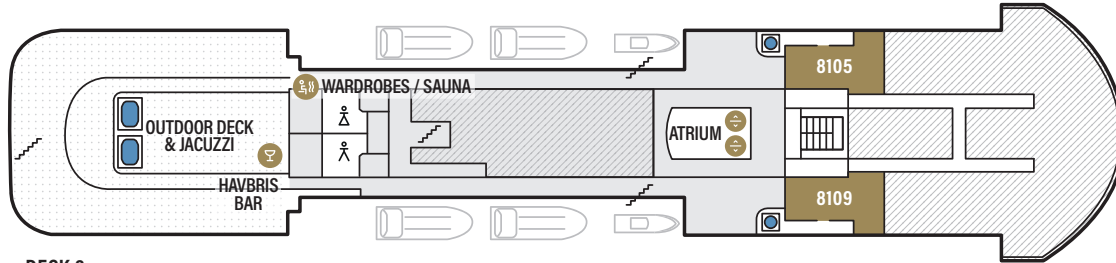
Deck Plans

FAQ

Before departure

How do I get the confirmation of my booking?

As soon as your order is confirmed, you will receive all the necessary travel documents via email. Additionally, you can access your documentation and all information related to your trip by logging into “My Voyage” at any time. If you prefer to have a paper copy of your trip details and ticket, you may print them out for convenience during check-in and boarding.

What documents do I need to bring to the ship?

Everyone must bring a valid ID and passport for identification on our longer voyages. Passports are not required for port-to-port travels. For travelers living in the Schengen area, it is sufficient to bring an internationally approved ID card. However, passports are a safe and well-known system of identification that will always be approved.

What insurance do I need?

All passengers are required to have a valid travel insurance. Read in detail about the official terms of the contract in our terms and conditions.

What should I bring with me?

Warm clothes, a hat and wool underwear are needed all year round. Even a nice summer day at sea can be chilly in Norway. Wind and waterproof clothing will come in handy and good and solid shoes for excursions ashore are also necessary. Binoculars to perceive the nature experiences even closer are a useful travel tool. The same goes for the camera so you can immortalize the memories and share the experience with others when you get home. You should have medicines and other necessary items in your hand luggage since other luggage may arrive at the cabin later than you.

Havila stops in 34 ports, can I visit all of them?

We stop at 34 ports on northbound journeys and 33 on southbound journeys. You can basically go ashore in all ports, but in some places, we stop in the middle of the night and in other ports there are only short stops. In many ports, however, the ship stays for a while, so you have time to look around and participate in our excursions. See the sailing schedule here.

To and from the ship

How do I get to Norway?

If you are flying to or from Norway, you can book your flight with airlines such as Norwegian, SAS, Logan Air, KLM, or Wideroe. Bergen has direct flights from approximately 30 airports around the world, including London, Manchester, Amsterdam, Berlin, and Paris. You can usually connect with many flights without needing extra overnights because of the ship's arrival and departure times. KLM offers great regional connections from the UK and many European airports.

How do I get to and from the ship from the airport?

In Bergen, you can take the airport express bus (Flybussen). The airport express bus (Flybussen) takes you from the airport, through its regular route past the hotels in the city centre and to the Jektevik Terminal at the harbour. In Kirkenes, there is a scheduled airport shuttle service available between Kirkenes Airport and Kirkenes Terminal, that corresponds with the departures (twice daily). The bus will conveniently transport you directly to the quay. If you arrive on the evening flight, you have the option to get off the bus at your hotel in the city center. In Kirkenes, If you arrive on the morning flight on the day of departure, you may have limited time before the ship's departure. In the event of a flight or bus delay from the airport, it is advisable to secure a taxi booking to ensure you arrive at the harbor punctually.

Are there any options for organized transport?

Bergen: In Bergen, we offer a 48-hour bus ticket that can be booked via the MyVoyage portal or request assistance from the reception or the excursion center if you're on board. You can also pre-book transfer to the city center train station. Our experienced staff will meet you at the exit and guide you off the ship. Remember to take all of your luggage and belongings with you. You will be escorted to the parking lot where the airport bus will be waiting to take you directly to the airport. The journey takes approximately 50 minutes by bus.

Kirkenes: If you have made a prior reservation for bus transportation in Kirkenes via the MyVoyage portal, your booking confirmation will serve as a valid ticket for boarding the bus.

FAQ

Check-in

When should I check in?

In general, check-in closes 15 minutes before departure. It depends on at which port you go on board. You do not need to check in in advance but show up and get on board the ship well in advance. You are responsible for arriving on time, the ship must keep the route and cannot wait. Therefore, ensure that you have plenty of time when you arrive by plane. Information about specific ports can be found on our website.

Bergen

In Bergen, check-in at the terminal ashore takes place between 15:00 and 19:30. You can also check-in on board until 20:15. Cabins can be accessed approximately 18:00.

Kirkenes

In Kirkenes you will check-in on board and follows the general rules for check in (latest 15 minutes before departure).

Where can I deliver my luggage?

In Bergen and Kirkenes you may deliver your luggage at the check-in, and it will be transported to the cabin. In other ports you must carry your own luggage on board and to the cabin. Knives and other weapons are prohibited and will be seized. The same holds true with other dangerous goods.

How do I receive security information?

Before departure in Bergen, all passengers must attend a mandatory safety training. Safety and warning systems, emergency exits, life jackets, and lifeboats are displayed on screens on board. Security videos with essential information are shown on TV screens throughout the trip. The information is available in Norwegian, English, and German.

What is the check-out time?

It is possible to purchase later check-out at the reception if it is available. In general, regular check-out from cabins is at noon. Some ports have other times.

- General: 12:00
- Bergen: 10:00
- Kirkenes: 08:00
- Tromsø (Southbound): 20:00

Facilities on board

Does the ship offer Wi-Fi?

Yes, Havila Voyages offers free Wi-Fi suited for basic everyday usage. Note that the bandwidth on board is not designed for data heavy tasks such as streaming or downloading large files.

Are there gyms on the ships?

Yes, our new ships have two well-equipped fitness rooms with a great view on deck 7. The fitness rooms have treadmills, rowing machines, bicycles, and various weights.

Are there telephones in the cabins?

Each cabin has a telephone to call the reception on board, but it cannot make or receive calls from outside the ship. Family and friends can contact you on the ship by calling the ship's reception desk.

Are there televisions in the cabins?

Every cabin has a television with international channels, used to provide daily updates, ship information, dining times, and more.

Jacuzzi

Our new ships have outdoor jacuzzies at the large outdoor area on deck 8. Please be aware that the Jacuzzi may occasionally be inaccessible for brief intervals due to routine maintenance.

Sauna

There are two lovely saunas located on deck 8, situated near the changing facilities and jacuzzis on the outdoor deck. One for men and one for women.

Laundry room

You can wash your clothes in the laundry facilities at deck 4. There are three washing machines that automatically dispense soap, three dryers, and ironing equipment.

Are there any activities for children on board?

The ship features a dedicated kids' corner located in the bow lounge on deck 6.

Do you provide any self-entertainment options for adults?

Yes, we offer board games, puzzles, and books in the bow lounge on deck 6.

Onboard experience

What is the dress code on board?

The dress code is casual, and there is no need to dress up for dinner.

What payment methods are accepted on board?

The main payment method on board is credit cards (Visa, Mastercard, and American Express). The official currency is NOK.

What can I purchase on board?

Snacks and simple meals in the café, while the shop offers a variety of products including toiletries, reading materials, souvenirs, woolen clothes, outerwear, and practical items like drinking bottles, backpacks, and binoculars.

Should I tip the staff?

The service charge is included, but you can tip if you like to.

What languages are used on board?

Written information in Norwegian, English and German. Many of the crew also speak German.

Is smoking allowed on board?

Yes, in the designated smoking area on deck 8, and cabin balconies.

Can I drink the tap water?

Yes, you can safely drink the tap water on board the ship and on land.

Can drones be flown from the ship?

No, it is prohibited to fly drones on board or from the ship. If you plan to use your drone on land, you must check the national regulations.

What happens if I become ill on board?

The ship has a first aid room and a safety officer on board. In the event that require medical attention, arrangements will be made at the nearest port. If it is an emergency, a rescue helicopter can be called.

Where can I store my medication?

There are refrigerators in all exterior cabins. If you stay in an interior cabin, you can contact the reception on board for assistance.

Can I upgrade my cabin?

If available, you can upgrade your cabin at any time. To do so, please contact our customer service before your trip or visit the reception on deck 4 while on board.

Is it allowed to bring alcohol?

For your own and others' safety, it is not permitted to bring alcohol or other drugs on board.

Food and beverage

Which meals are included?

Breakfast, lunch, and dinner are included in your voyage. You can enjoy high quality meals made from locally sourced ingredients, served à la carte, with the freedom to eat as many dishes as you would like.

What beverages are included?

There is still water for free on board, which we serve with every meal together with coffee and tea. For breakfast you have the option of orange juice, apple juice or milk. Other beverages incur an additional cost. We also have beverage packages.

Where and when can I eat?

Havrand is our main restaurant, where all standard meals will be served including breakfast, lunch, and dinner. Meal times are listed on board and on our webpage. If you miss a meal, or are going on an excursion, you may buy hot and cold food in Havly café on deck 6, which is open from morning until late at night.

Can I book a table in advance?

You may get a table assigned to you to keep the entire journey, earliest at the port terminal in Bergen before departure. Or the first time you arrive at Havrand restaurant on deck 6.

Can I eat at Hildring Fine Dining?

You can book a table in our fine-dining restaurant Hildring both online before departure, and on board by contacting the crew. This will incur an additional cost.

Can you prepare meals to my diet restrictions?

Yes, to ensure we prepare foods in accordance with your allergies and dietary restrictions, please inform our crew once you are on board, and we will make every effort to accommodate your needs with the options available. However, we encourage you to contact our customer centre no earlier than three weeks before your departure before the journey, to properly arrange your diet.

Are vegan and vegetarian meal options available on board?

Yes! We proudly offer a wide array of vegan dishes as a standard part of our menu. You will find a diverse selection of vegan options to choose from, all crafted to deliver the same culinary excellence as our other menu items.

Can I order room service?

Passengers may order delivery at an additional fee.

Onshore excursions

How do I book an excursion?

You can book excursions before your trip via our online booking system MyVoyage, or by contacting customer center. Once your voyage has departed you can book excursion on board by contacting the expedition team. Note that the prices are lower when booked beforehand.

What languages are spoken on excursions?

The spoken languages of most of our excursions are Norwegian, English, and German.

Are the excursions suitable for disabled passengers?

Our excursions are divided into three different levels based on physical activity. Level 1 is suitable for everyone, however we can not guarantee that they are suited for all disabilities. You should consult our customer center beforehand or the expedition team on board to get more information or suggestions.

Do we get food on the excursions?

Some of the excursions have no meals or only simple snacks and drinks, while other excursions offer whole meals. If you have booked a trip with a full pension on the ship and cannot attend a meal on board because you are attending an excursion, this meal will not be refunded.

What happens when there is an excursion at the same time as a meal on board?

Contact the head waiter outside Havrand on deck 6, to find out if you can rearrange your meal at a time that does not conflict with the excursion. If that's not possible, we suggest to get a meal at Havly Cafe.

What happens if I get ill and miss an excursion?

Excursion bookings are binding. If you're unable to attend due to illness, we kindly ask you to talk to your insurance company.

Service issues

What should I do if I encounter problems with the services during my trip?

If you notice any issues, please report them to us immediately. Prompt communication allows us to solve problems quickly and ensures you qualify for possible resolutions.

What if I don't report the issue immediately?

If you don't report the problem right away, or decline a reasonable fix when offered, it may affect your ability to claim further compensation or remedies.

Cancellations

What happens if an excursion is cancelled?

Unfortunately, excursions can be cancelled. In case of cancellations you'll receive a full refund of the paid amount.

What if my trip is cancelled after it has started?

Should your trip be disrupted after it has begun, we'll arrange for your transportation back to the departure point at no extra cost, as soon as possible based on your safety and the conditions of the situation.

Who do I contact regarding refunds?

If you're entitled to a refund due to any cancellations or service disruptions, please contact the point of your purchase. Whether you booked onboard or online, our team is ready to assist you promptly. Make sure you provide us with any documentation that might help speed up the process.
