Oslo Airport (OSL)

Oslo's main airport (OSL), also known as Oslo Gardermoen Airport or simply Gardermoen, is situated 50 kilometres north of the Norwegian capital. The airport coaches and high-speed trains depart regularly for central Oslo.

The train takes about 20 minutes and there are two trains to choose from:

- The Airport Express Train (Flytoget)
- Vy (formerly NSB), the national Norwegian railway company

There are also several buses to take from the airport, one of them is Airport Express Coach (Flybussen) which runs every 20 minutes every day between the airport and the city centre.

Taxis are represented at the airport, just head over to the taxi information desk in the arrival hall where you will get information about the fixed rates of the different taxi companies. They can also help you book a taxi, otherwise, the taxi rank is just outside the arrival hall.

Airport

Amsterdam Airport Schiphol (AMS) is a modern, efficient and traveller-friendly airport. 90 airlines depart from Schiphol to over 250 destinations worldwide. The easiest and cheapest way to travel from the airport to Amsterdam is by train. This takes about 20 minutes to the Central Station and trains leave at least every 15 minutes during the daytime (less frequently at night). The train station at Amsterdam Airport Schiphol is located directly below the airport. Tickets are for sale at the NS service desk or ticket machines.

Taxis to the city centre cost significantly more and can take a while, depending on traffic conditions.

Southern National Parks - The Region

Situated in southern Utah are five national parks of spectacular beauty, each with unique geological formations, cliffs, rivers, and canyons of incredible colours. The most well-known parks are Bryce Canyon, with its weird, orange hoodoo formations and the magnificent canyons of Zion National Park.

Canyonlands is the largest national park in Utah, a largely inaccessible landscape eroded into countless canyons and plateaus by the Colorado and Green Rivers that divide the park into three districts. The most accessible area of the park is the Island in the Sky District, which offers breath-taking views. The Needles Region features spires, arches and red and white striped rock pinnacles that hold numerous opportunities for hikers. The rugged Maze District is the most remote section and is practically inaccessible.

The more visitor-friendly red desert landscape of Arches National Park features thousands of natural sandstone arches and other fantastic rock formations such as pinnacles, balanced rocks and spires that can be reached by short trails or roads, making the major sights easily accessible. Famous landmarks include Fiery Furnace, Balanced Rock and the park's most famous feature, Delicate Arch.

In the centre of Utah is the state's newest park, Capitol Reef. The most splendid geological feature here is the multi-layered orange, red and white cliff wall that formed a seemingly impassable rock barrier to early pioneers, stretching for hundreds of miles and known as the Waterpocket Fold. Lifted up by forces within the earth's crust, the peaks and pinnacles formed sandstone sections that reminded them of the white domes of capitol buildings.

There are very few roads bisecting the southwestern region and it is difficult to access most of the backcountry, even within the national parks, where roads are limited to high-clearance vehicles, hikers and mountain bikers. One of the best ways to experience the landscape is by river and there are numerous companies offering white water rafting and gentle river trips with plenty of opportunities to admire the scenery.

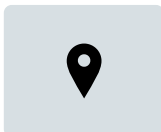

Beyond Las Vegas

There are over 100 different tours offered by a variety of companies in Las Vegas, including sightseeing to the Hoover Dam, Grand Canyon, Lake Mead, the Colorado River, Red Rock, the Valley of Fire, and Mount Charleston. The tours last from 2 to 10 hours, and they can be taken by van, bus, aeroplane, boat, or helicopter.

One of the most exciting tours is the Grand Canyon Sunset Tour: leave by helicopter, make a low-level flight over the Hoover Dam and Lake Mead, and land at the Grand Canyon for a Champagne picnic at sunset before returning to the lights of the Las Vegas Strip.

If you have a car, it is an easy drive from the Las Vegas Strip to the Hoover Dam and Lake Mead (31 miles/51 km), Mount Charleston (40 miles/64 km), Red Rock Canyon National Conservation Area (15 miles/24 km) and the Valley of Fire (53 miles/85 km).

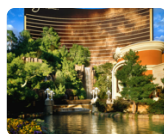

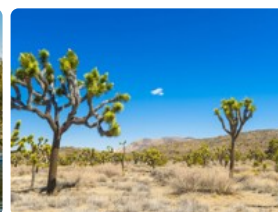

Palm Springs, California - The City

Palm Springs owes its name to the abundant California palm trees and the hot mineral springs around which the city's original inhabitants, the Agua Caliente Band of Cahuilla Indians, built their village thousands of years ago. European settlers did not establish themselves in the area until the late 1800s. In the 1920s, Hollywood stars began to create a retreat from Tinseltown in this desert town.

It continues to be a favorite vacation spot for celebrities, but it has grown into a major resort town, popular among tourists from all walks of life. In addition to vacationers, Palm Springs is also home to a resident population of about 45,000. This is due to a rise in construction in the middle of the 20th century, as well as Coachella Valley's popularity as a retirement destination.



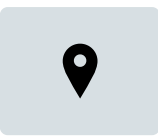

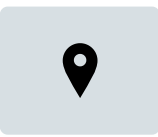

San Diego, California - The City

With an estimated population of nearly 1.4 million people, San Diego ranks as the second-largest city in California and the eighth-largest in the United States. The city is home to the nation's largest military community that together with a diversity of neighborhoods provide San Diego with a unique flavor.

Napa, California - The City

Napa, California is one of the state's Golden Oldies; with a history extending back to 1847, it draws its beginnings from the California Gold Rush. Initially inhabited by Native Americans who lived harmoniously among the area's elk, deer, grizzly bears, and cougars for centuries, Napa was then explored by Europeans in 1823. Spanish priests led the expeditions and sought to proselytize the Native populations (some with success). Spanish presence would vacillate to American settlements soon thereafter, as farmers began to arrive in the 1830s.

Nathan Coombs founded the City of Napa in 1847, following the purchase of 80 acres of Rancho Entre Napa from Nicholas Higuera. The city's first business was a saloon, with the first general store being opened a year later. The California Gold Rush of the late 1850s led to Napa's expansion and considerable economic success, and the Valley's Great Silver Rush in 1858 also contributed to the city's burgeoning mining industry.

It should not be overlooked that, much like all of California's cities and towns, Napa itself was carved from the hardships and sweat of foreign-born laborers. Individuals from China's Canton province, Southern Europe's coastal provinces, Italy, and various other nations made the arduous trip overseas to meet the demand for workers in what were considered "dirty" jobs. Such investment led to the vibrant and modern city that Napa is today, and the citizens have done incredibly well to preserve this history in the numerous monuments and buildings that remain erect.

Prestigious vineyards, renowned hospitality, acclaimed cuisines and restaurants, and exquisite hotels comprise Napa's attractions. It has become a widely successful tourism-based industry, and myriads of visitors each year discover why.

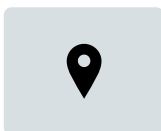
